

#12: Art and Architecture

Journey through some of the highlights of London's most photographed architecture and most-viewed works of art. Walk across the magnificent Millenium Bridge, and ride the wondrous London Eye. Modes of transportation include the London Underground, a bus, and walking.



Houses of Parliament & Westminster Abbey (exterior views only)

Once the home of the royal family, and still officially a royal palace, the buildings that now make up the modern Houses of Parliament.

St Paul's Cathedral (interior including guided tour)

There have been a number of St Paul's churches/cathedrals throughout the centuries – three of them destroyed by fire.

Today's cathedral was designed by Sir Christopher Wren and the final touches were made in 1708.

Millennium Bridge, a.k.a. The Wobbly Bridge

A 325m steel bridge linking the City of London at St. Paul's Cathedral with the Tate Modern Gallery at Bankside, the Millennium Bridge had a very auspicious opening in 2000, which gave it its nickname – the Wobbly Bridge.

Globe Theatre

The Globe Theatre is a faithful reconstruction of the open-air playhouse designed in 1599, where Shakespeare worked and for which he wrote many of his greatest plays. Exhibition and Tour.
